SCHEDULE AND PROGRAM: The program will begin at 2:00 pm on Tuesday, June 4 and end at noon on Thursday, June 6. A plenary presentation by each speaker will be followed by small and large group dialogue. A new feature this year will be a shared movie on our final evening! Overall our conference seeks to develop a holistic experience, with varied inputs, including worship. A short business meeting is also on the schedule.

PRE-CONFERENCE MIMETIC THEORY OVERVIEW: A free pre-conference program is offered from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm on Tuesday, June 4th, providing an immersion in Mimetic Theory, the anthropological understanding at the heart of Theology and Peace. Includes continental breakfast (lunch available for purchase at the college). For those traveling from distance and attending this program there is accommodation at the college on Monday night. Please indicate on registration form below.

LOCATION: The Conference will be held at UNC Chapel Hill North Carolina (specifically, Hardin Hall, located at 495 Paul Hardin Drive Chapel Hill, NC 27514). The closest airport is Raleigh/Durham (RDU). Shuttles (with fare) will be arranged.

ACCOMMODATIONS AND MEALS: Single or double rooms in residence halls (with private or semi-private bath) are available. The conference fee includes meals beginning with dinner on Tuesday and ending with breakfast on Thursday. If staying off campus, register as a Commuter. Parking is available for additional fee of \$6.00 per day. Requests for parking must be made to the Conference Registrar by 5/20/2013.

DUES: Theology and Peace is a membership organization, though our Conference is open to all. Dues provide conference seed money and other resources related to peace theology and practice. Please consider joining!

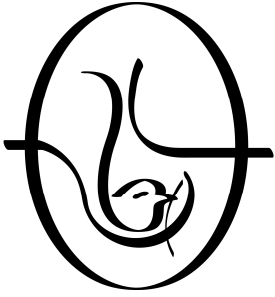
